ALL ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The Build Dakota Scholarship is a full ride, not a free ride. Following program completion, each student works in their field of study for a minimum of three years in South Dakota. In return, the scholarship covers costs for tuition, fees, books and other program expenses.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Scholars of all ages are welcome to apply. This includes both in-state and out-of-state students.



WHAT'S THE COMMITMENT?

A Build Dakota Scholar agrees to:

- Enroll full-time in a Build Dakota Scholarship-eligible program at a South Dakota technical college (Lake Area Technical College, Mitchell Technical College, Southeast Technical College, or Western Dakota Technical College). Diploma programs typically require 1 to 1.5 years to complete and AAS degree programs require 2 years.
- Work full-time in South Dakota in the field of study for a minimum of three years following program completion.
- Maintain a 2.5 cumulative grade point average.
- Adhere to the technical college's attendance policy.
- If the scholar has an industry partner, the partner may have additional requirements outlined in writing before the commitment is finalized.

HOW DO INDUSTRY PARTNERSHIPS WORK?

Students can earn a Build Dakota Scholarship through the application process – or by finding an industry partner. An industry partner is a business that sponsors students and commits to paying a portion of their program expenses. Build Dakota picks up the other portion. The student earns a degree, and the employer gains a skilled scholar.

Students aren't required to have a Build Dakota partner to apply – but it's highly encouraged. This is how we're turning a scholarship into something that impacts businesses throughout the workforce, helping companies grow their talent pipeline.

HOW COMMUNITIES CAN PARTICIPATE

CURATE CONVERSATIONS ABOUT WORKFORCE

You can work with our Program Manager to host Community Conversations About Workforce. You'll arrange the time and place and send the invites, and our group does the rest. These community conversations are designed to help identify workforce needs in that community and strategize about how high schools, economic development and businesses are working as a team to fill those needs.

PROMOTE LOCAL CAREERS & OPPORTUNITIES

If we're going to make an impact on the workforce shortage, it starts with collaborative efforts at the local level. You can work with local businesses and community partners to spread the word and share opportunities for workforce growth. This can also be done at the technical college level. When we build better relationships between the technical college and the businesses who hire their students, everyone benefits.

HELP RECRUIT

We need to work together to promote local job opportunities to new audiences, including non-traditional students: people who have started college and quit or people who have never pursued higher education. These audiences are perfect for hands-on learning.

SPONSOR STUDENTS

Economic development groups can directly sponsor students to fill a workforce need in their community or consider offering grants to their local businesses to offset the expense for them to partner.

ENCOURAGE CAREER EXPLORATION

Economic development groups have a unique opportunity to bridge the gap between local businesses and schools. Students can't explore career paths they don't know exist. That's where you can step in, educating students and instructors on specific career fields and open positions in the area.

How can you start? Make a list of businesses in your community and the areas in which they are hiring. Keep it updated each year and provide it to your local high school to make connecting between the two easier for job shadowing/internships/part-time work.

Below you'll find a sample career inventory map. Not only does it help students identify local businesses, it helps them see how a range of occupations are needed at each business. Even if some of these careers go beyond the Build Dakota scope, creating opportunity maps helps everyone see the big picture.

STUDENTS
