APPLYING FOR BUILD DAKOTA

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The Build Dakota Scholarship is a full ride, not a free ride. Following program completion, each student works in their field of study for at least three years in South Dakota. In return, the scholarship covers tuition, fees, books and other program expenses.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Scholars of all ages are welcome to apply.

This includes both in-state and out-of-state students.

WHAT'S THE COMMITMENT?

A Build Dakota Scholar agrees to:

- Enroll full-time in a Build Dakota Scholarship-eligible program at a South Dakota technical college (Lake Area Technical College, Mitchell Technical College, Southeast Technical College, or Western Dakota Technical College). Diploma programs typically require 1 to 1.5 years to complete and AAS degree programs require 2 years.
- Work full-time in South Dakota in the field of study for a minimum of three years following program completion.
- Maintain a 2.5 cumulative grade point average.
- Adhere to the technical college's attendance policy.
- If the scholar has an industry partner, the partner may have additional requirements outlined in writing before the commitment is finalized.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO HELP

GET A HEAD START

There's no replacement for real experience. One of the biggest advantages for any Build Dakota Scholarship application is proof that the student has explored their chosen career. Help your student arrange part-time work and job shadows in areas they might be interested in. Something that starts small may even turn into an industry partnership.


VISIT TECHNICAL COLLEGES

It's good to know what to expect before you go. All four South Dakota technical colleges host free program exploration days. Visit the technical colleges' admission pages to see the latest dates and upcoming events. You can also work with the admission team to schedule one-on-one visits for a personalized experience.



ASSIST WITH REVIEWING CONTRACTS

The Build Dakota Scholarship is a life-changing opportunity. But it's also a big commitment. Not only is there a contract the student signs with Build Dakota, but a separate contract they agree to with their industry partner. Help your student review the contract and understand exactly what is expected of them when they put their name on the dotted line.



HELP FIND AN INDUSTRY PARTNER

Students can earn a Build Dakota Scholarship through the application process — or by finding an industry partner. What are those? An industry partner is a business that sponsors students and commits to paying a portion of their program expenses. Build Dakota picks up the other portion. With a partner, students strengthen their scholarship application and have a job waiting for them upon program completion.

PATHS TO PARTNER MATCHES



IF THE STUDENT ALREADY HAS A PARTNER SECURED, there will be questions for the student to provide this information in the application.

The technical college will contact an employer on the student's behalf if they have questions or if assistance is needed.

APPLY WITHOUT A PARTNER

and a technical college will share the application with industry partners.

Students might be contacted by an employer for next steps. We recommend applying early in the application window as employers reach out quickly.
